Indian Philosopher, Academic, Statesman and **1st Bharat Ratna** (1954) and **1st Sahitya Akademi Fellowship** (1968). He defended Hinduism against what he called "**uninformed Western criticism**", **contributing to the formation of contemporary Hindu identity**.
